

2011 Disease Reporting Requirements Key Changes for Providers

Additions

- Brucellosis, animal (except dogs) – to be reported within seven (7) calendar days
- Cyclospora - to be reported within seven (7) calendar days
- Hepatitis E, acute infection – to be reported within (7) calendar days
- Rickettsial Diseases (non-Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever), including Typhus and Typhus-like Illnesses – to be reported within (7) calendar days
- Tularemia, animal – to be reported within seven (7) calendar days

Changes

- Anthrax **to** Anthrax, human or animal – to be reported immediately by telephone
- Avian Influenza (human) **to** Influenza, novel strains (human) – to be reported immediately by telephone
- Brucellosis **to** Brucellosis, human
- Hepatitis A **to** Hepatitis A, acute infection
- Hepatitis D (Delta) **to** Hepatitis D (Delta), acute infection
- Influenza deaths (report an incident of less than 18 years of age) **to** Influenza, deaths in laboratory-confirmed cases for ages 0-64 years
- Measles (Rubeola) reporting from one working day **to** immediately by phone
- Tularemia **to** Tularemia, human
- Viral Hemorrhagic Fevers (e.g., Crimean-Congo, Ebola, Lassa and Marburg viruses) **to** Viral Hemorrhagic Fevers, human or animal (e.g., Crimean-Congo, Ebola, Lassa and Marburg viruses) – to be reported immediately by telephone

Deletions

- Acute Rheumatic Fever
- Colorado Tick Fever
- Hepatitis, other, acute
- Hepatitis, viral
- Kawasaki Syndrome
- Streptococcal infections, outbreaks of any type and individual cases in food handlers and dairy workers only
- Typhus Fever
- Water associated disease (e.g. Swimmer's Itch and Hot Tub Rash).
